Lech (page 106)

A picturesque village with a pretty river and a 14th century church, Lech is a prestigious resort with superior quality hotels, which has long been a Royal Family favourite. Lech combines its timeless charm with easy access to the slopes and lifts, and is ideal for both intermediate and advanced skiers.

Oberlech (page 108)

Offering one of the best ski locations in the Arlberg and arguably one of the most impressive panoramic views of the surrounding Arlberg mountains.
